"Foundations of the Club"

The February edition of The Civic Courier, "Foundations of the Club" is highlighting Shirley Williams and focusing on the Officers of the Club.



Shirley Williams

Shirley Williams and her husband permanently moved to Panama City Beach in 1995 from Helen, Georgia after alternating time between their log cabin in Helen seven months of the year and other destinations throughout Florida the other five months. In Panama City Beach, along with other snowbirds, they became actively involved in square dancing where they would "circle left" "do si do" six nights a week. In addition to dancing, she liked to play cards, play bunco, participate in water aerobics, play golf and travel.

Sadly, her husband was diagnosed with cancer in 1996 and wanting to make sure Shirley stayed involved, he encouraged her to join the Women's Civic Club after he had seen an article about the club and decided it was the place for her. She was installed in May 1997 just before her husband passed away in July.

Shirley has three children, two daughters and a son, three grandchildren and two great grandchildren. After having no "related" family in Panama City Beach for twenty-six years, she decided to move to Ormond Beach, Florida to be close to her daughter. Shirley was quick to point out that many tears were shed when she had to leave the "friend" family in Panama City Beach.

Over twenty years, Shirley and her friend Glenda worked at the library. She was also actively involved with domestic violence. As Corresponding Secretary and Chair of the Sunshine Committee, she would send out cards, deliver flowers and visit people. She said it was an opportunity for her to get to know people.

When asked if she had any advice for club members, she said "always deliver with a smile and be kind to others."

Officers of the Club

Club officers play an important role in assuring club activities are driven by the Constitution and the By-Laws of the organization. Serving as an officer provides opportunities for developing skills by working together to accomplish club goals, improving communication by writing, leading and speaking. The Women's Civic Club has six officers: President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. At the January General Meeting, a nominating committee was appointed by the President and the slate of officers proposed by the committee will be presented at the February General Meeting. During the March General Meeting, after reading the proposed slate of officers, the President will call for any additional nominations from the floor. (Ref: ByLaws, Article V., Section 1)

Not every member of the club chooses to serve as an officer, but some may like to have the opportunity. If this is a role you would like to pursue, make it known. You may like the opportunity and have the skills, but feel you are not ready. Talk with the current officer and ask if they would mentor you and help you prepare for the office. It is extremely helpful to serve as a Chair or Co-Chair and attend the board meetings where you will gain understanding of the workings of the club and deeper knowledge of the Constitution and the By-Laws of our organization. Officers must be available to attend the board and general meetings. Listed below are some of the duties and skills required of each officer. (Ref: By-Laws, Article VI., Section $\underline{1}$)

<u>President:</u> Presides at every meeting, maintains order, enforces the Constitution and By-Laws, acts as Chairman of the Boards, appoints committees and is automatically a member of all committees. Represents the club at events and to the public and should always be positive and professional. Will need access to computer to prepare the agendas, to internet in order to communicate with the members and writing skills for the preparation of the President messages.

<u>First Vice President:</u> Assists the President and presides in the absence of the President, serves as the Chairman of Membership and Installation Officer. Will need access to a computer and a working knowledge of Excel and Word for maintaining the membership database and access to internet to communicate with members and potential members.

<u>Second Vice President</u>: Presides in the absence of the First Vice President and/or President, serves as Chairman of the Luncheons and Programs Committee for all General Meetings. Organizational, negotiation and coordination skills are an important part of this role.

<u>Recording Secretary</u>: Keeps, in a permanent form, the minutes of each General Meeting and the minutes of each Board meeting and presents them at the following respective meeting. Prepares the history of the work accomplished by the club each year and submits for presentation in the yearbook. Will need access to a computer and a working knowledge of Word. Writing and listening skills are important in this role.

<u>Corresponding Secretary</u>: Responsible for all the correspondence files, serves as Chairman of the Sunshine Committee which is responsible for sending out birthday, get well and sympathy cards and coordinates memorial gifts. Organizational, writing and compassion is important for this role.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Makes payments and reimburse expenses, deposits luncheon checks and ticket sales (dance/silent auction/art & craft), prepares donation checks for December meeting, reconciles monthly bank statement, prepares financial reports for board meetings and luncheon meetings and presents these reports to the group, files for FL sales tax exemption, purchases insurance/liquor license as necessary for dance and/or special beach events, monitors committees expenses to ensure they are within their budget, prepares the annual budget, makes recommendations for additional expenditures of funds if excess funds are available, assists with preparation of annual federal tax return. Prepares and files bi-annual sales tax returns, an annual solicitation report with the Florida Department of Agriculture and an annual report to the Florida Secretary of State. Responsible for ensuring that required signatures are updated at the bank for both the checking account and safety deposit box. Responsible for safekeeping of the VISA charge card, petty cash, safe deposit box key and the storage facility key. The quickbooks for accounting and reporting is installed on the club's owned laptop and can be quickly mastered by someone with some computer experience. Must have access to a printer, copier and internet.


