The food pantry served 279 clients in September and August for a total of 2,511 meals. As a comparison the pantry served 196 clients the previous two month (June and July) for a total of 1,764 meals.

Our W.C.C donations, along with several other organizations, businesses and individuals, make it possible for the pantry to be open three days a week; Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9-12. Currently clients may come to the pantry once a week.

If any of you would like to see how the food pantry operates, please email me and I, or another volunteer, will be glad to show you the facility located at Gulf Beach Presbyterian Church, on Highway 79 between Back Beach and Front Beach Road.

Our donations are most welcome and after every donation from our Club I receive a nice email from Sandy and Tony Young, coordinators of the pantry, for our continued support.
